

the film follows mark zuckerberg; a harvard student and programming prodigy; who; after being dumped by his girlfriend; creates a controversial website called facemash that gains massive attention on campus. this leads him to develop the facebook with the help of his friend eduardo saverin; who provides initial funding.

as facebook grows rapidly; tensions build. zuckerberg faces lawsuits from the winklevoss twins; who claim he stole their idea.also;his former friend and co-founder saverin; who feels betrayed after being pushed out of the company.

the story is told through flashbacks during legal depositions; blending sharp dialogue with a portrait of ambition; innovation; and betrayal in the tech world.


